# Premier Event

## Place of Hope's 6<sup>th</sup> Annual Hope Bash Boca

On Nov. 3, Place of Hope at the Leighan and David Rinker Campus will celebrate its Sixth Annual Hope Bash Boca at Broken Sound Club in Boca Raton with a reception, dinner, dancing, entertainment and a live auction. Funds raised will support programs and housing for foster children and teens – many of whom have aged out of foster care and are at risk of homelessness.

At the Bash, Place of Hope is honoring GL Homes as the 2018 Jay DiPietro Hero of Hope for the company's support of children and youth in need. This is the first time Place of Hope has honored a corporation with this award.

Place of Hope will also honor its first Pacesetter Award recipient, Cartiana Auguste, for her outstanding achievements. Cartiana came to Place of Hope during her senior year of high school. She received the Frione Family Scholarship to attend Everglades University in Boca Raton, and is now a college graduate and a homeowner.

Place of Hope is a faith-based, state-licensed children's organization providing family-style foster care; family outreach and intervention; maternity care; safety for victims of domestic minor sex trafficking; transitional housing and support services for youth aging out of foster care; housing and support services for homeless families; foster care recruitment and support; and healing for children and families who have been traumatized by abuse and neglect throughout our region.
